















SR KG THEME FITNESS FUN








Onam Celebrations 13.09.24

Highlights of the Trip:


- •Tea Museum Visit: Students discovered the fascinating process of tea cultivation and processing while learning about the region's rich history of tea plantations.


















National HIV / AIDS Aging Awareness Day at SAN Academy, Kamakoti Nagar.
