


Kids learnt how magic words are important to make others happy.excuse me,sorry,welcome,please,thank your and also learnt it with action which taught them when and why to use it.

The children had an interactive session.




Respective class teachers of classes 6 to 8 gave a brief detailed description of Design Thinking and its elements. Students enthusiastically participated in today's activity.





