HORTICULTURE

On a visit to the San Pal Garden, 87 students participated in an insightful session on Garden Maintenance led by Mr. Shankar, where they learned the importance of horticultural practices in sustaining healthy, vibrant gardens. The session covered key techniques like pruning to remove damaged or diseased plant material, training plants for optimal growth, and implementing efficient irrigation systems, such as drip irrigation, to conserve water while ensuring hydration Students explored integrated pest management strategies to mitigate pests and diseases and gained knowledge on soil management practices like composting and targeted fertilization to enhance soil quality. By adopting these sustainable methods, the students gained a holistic understanding of creating resilient and aesthetically appealing gardens, fostering an appreciation for the intricate balance of nature and the art of gardening.

















CARPENTRY

On November 23, 2024, at the Arabian Tent, 61 students participated in an engaging session on Making a Keychain Holder under the guidance of Mr. Rahul. The activity encouraged creativity, teamwork, and problem-solving as students selected smooth wooden planks, followed step-by-step instructions, and assembled personalized keychain holders. The session also included crafting keychains, adding a fun, personal touch to the experience. Students learned to use carpentry tools, apply safety protocols, and practice essential techniques like measuring, cutting, sanding, and assembling, enhancing their fine motor skills and handeye coordination. Many pledged to gift their creations to loved ones, making the activity both meaningful and enjoyable.

DESIGN THINKING

Through design thinking, students from Classes 6 to 8 explored innovative solutions across diverse topics. Class 6 reimagined sundials into forms like vertical, solar-powered, artistic, and smart designs, enhancing functionality and appeal. Class 7 delved into hybrid plants, creating sustainable solutions such as "Solar Trees," "Vertical Farms," "Bio-Domes," and "Smart Gardens" to address environmental challenges. Class 8 used sketching to understand different types of motion, from pendulums and gears to waves and projectile motion, uncovering realworld applications of physics. These activities showcased how empathy, ideation. and creativity drive meaningful innovation.





















ELECTRICAL TECHNOLOGY

On November 23, 2024, a session on the Basics of Digital Electronics was conducted for 114 students of Classes 6 to 8 in venues 6A, 6B, and 6C. The session introduced fundamental concepts such as digital systems, logic gates, ICs, and their applications, emphasizing the need for digital systems over analog through comparisons and real-world examples. Students explored the importance of digital electronics in a technology-driven world, developing problem-solving skills, enhancing STEM knowledge, and fostering creativity. Hands-on projects like LED circuits, traffic light systems, and home automation were demonstrated through videos, making the learning interactive and inspiring young minds to innovate and excel in the digital era.


FOOD PROCESSING

POCSO Committee Meeting

POCSO Committee Meeting was held on 23rd November 2024 in Sr. Kg. C Classroom at San Academy, Pallikaranai between 11:30 am. and 12:30 pm. 11 committee members participated and discussed that a fixed date must have been scheduled to make all the committee members to get participated. It was also decided that every month the third Saturday can be scheduled for the POCSO Committee Meeting between 11 am and 12 am. And if any changes in the date and timings that can be intimated. Principal, Ms. Hemalatha Sooryanarayanan announced that the same committee members will be involved for the safety and welfare committee as well (Anti-Drug Committee) as per the circular received from the state government. Ms. Aishwarya, one of the committee members, completed her **POCSO Enabler Training Programme and created awareness** about the importance of having the POCSO Committee in the school and also insisted the members to become a certified trainer on the same. It was also decided that the admin people also should be oriented about the POCSO Act and the same has been approved and scheduled for the month of December. It was also expected to use the jargon terms related to POCSO at least in the meetings to have an open talk. Plan of conducting many sessions related to bullying, body shaming, use of inappropriate words and languages, gender stereotypes, etc. for students was made that will be implemented as much as possible by the committee members.

During this session, she explained the POCSO Acts and the different offenses with punishments. She also briefed about the salient features of POCSO act and the provisions and facilities given to the children as this act is a child-friendly act. She also created general awareness on the identification of victims, mandatory reporting, responsible figures for reporting and some unsupportive behaviours of treating the victims. It was emphasized that the teachers are playing a vital role in the students' lives as the children from age 3 to 17 are spending most of their time in school with them, so it is important to know the crucial role played by all the teachers. The session ended with some questions and answers which were clarified to the point.
