
PROMOTING HOLISTIC DEVELOPMENT

These early language experiences help to build effective communication and listening skills that are essential for a young child's learning. It also encourages emotional development in a child, as he or she shares their interests and joy with peers. 

Under the sea, there are volcanoes also. When these volcanoes erupt, they release chlorine. Even in the sea there are some sodium particles. When this sodium particles and the chlorine meet, chemical reaction happens and NaCl is formed. NaCl is the edible salt that we put in dishes.

Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam – "The Missile Man" Avul Pakir Jainulabdeen Abdul Kalam, popularly known as Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam was an aerospace scientist and former President of India. He served as the President of India from 2002 to 2007. Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam was born on 15th October 1931 in the small Dhanuskodi village of Rameswaram, Tamilnadu. He was born in the middle –class Tamil Muslim family. His father Jainulabdeen was a fisherman and imam of a local mosque, his mother Ashimma was housewife.

Kalam was the youngest of his four brothers and one sister in his family. Kalam's family condition was not that much good.

He computed his education from Saint Joseph College, Tiruchirappalli, and then graduated from the University of Madras in Physics and studied Aerospace engineering from Madras Institute of Technology.

He joined DRDO as a scientist and got transferred to ISRO in 1969. Meanwhile he was elected as a satellite launch project director of India. He played major role in the mission "PRITHVI" and "AGNI". During this period Pokhran –II nuclear tests were conducted and he played an intensive political and technological role and due to all these contributions, he was known as "Missile Man" of India.

On 27th July 2019, Dr. Abdul Kalam took his last breath and his soul dismissed to rest heavenly forever.
















CULMINATING ACTIVITY 2019-20
