

From Principal's Desk Time Management Strategy to stay focused and motivated

As we all love to be life long learners and basically to have good schedule of work, it is better to have good habits and methods to be more productive and effective in the energy and time we invest. The Pomodoro Technique is an effective time management technique for students and individuals who work across a variety of fields. It's also effective for those who frequently have to accomplish repetitive tasks or get easily distracted. By breaking down your tasks into units or pomodoros, you are able to see time as a concrete event and estimate the duration needed to finish a task. This makes it easier to commit to a task and have better focus. The Pomodoro Technique is a time management strategy that was developed in the late 80s by Italian Francesco Cirillo.

How Does the Pomodoro Technique Timer Work? The Pomodoro Technique Timer is simple and straightforward. It is best used when tackling big tasks or projects that seem to overwhelm you to the point that you avoid getting started simply because you don't know where to begin. Choose a task or project to break down and work on. Set your timer for 25-30 minutes and focus on that particular task until the timer goes off.

When your session is up, mark it as one pomodoro. (One 25-minute session is one pomodoro.)

Take a break for five minutes before continuing on. After four pomodoros, take a longer break for 15 to 30 minutes. Make sure to record each pomodoro you complete in your notebook or app.

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While the process is easy enough to follow, the Pomodoro Technique also has three rules that must be observed to maximize your productivity. These are: Simplify complex tasks. The Pomodoro Technique emphasizes breaking down big projects into bite-size tasks that you can complete in 25 minutes. If a task needs more than four pomodoros to complete, you will have to divide it into even smaller steps so you can have a clearer picture of your progress. Group small tasks together. Meanwhile, if a task can be done in five minutes instead of 25, you should find similar quick tasks to combine them with to complete one full pomodoro session. Stick to the task assigned in your pomodoro. The Pomodoro Technique requires that you focus on a specific task for a 25-minute period. This means you can't stop to reply to text messages or check your email and group chats. Here are more reasons as to why the Pomodoro Technique Timer is a great way to improve your productivity: Here are more reasons as to why the Pomodoro Technique Timer is a great way to improve your productivity: It prevents procrastination. Even when you intend to work and get started on your tasks, little distractions can always lead you to procrastinate. It can lead to missed deadlines, falling behind on your work duties or school projects, and add stress. It turns work into a fun game. If you like games, the Pomodoro Technique Timer can be a fun way of getting your tasks accomplished. Think of the timer as a countdown, and each pomodoro is a level that you need to pass. भारत में शिक्षा नीति 2020 (NEP)

राष्ट्रीय शिक्षा नीति 2020 में 4 भाग और 27 अध्याय हैं। नीति में, भारत सरकार ने बच्चों की शिक्षा को प्रभावित करने वाली विभिन्न बाधाओं और स्थितियों का मसौदा तैयार किया है। मसौदा शुरू में परिचयात्मक भाग से शुरू होता है, जिसमें बच्चों की मूलभूत आवश्यकता, मानव क्षमता को कैसे प्राप्त किया जाए, समाज में समानता और न्याय का विकास, राष्ट्रीय विकास, गुणवत्तापूर्ण शिक्षा, वैज्ञानिक उन्नति, राष्ट्रीय एकीकरण और सांस्कृतिक संरक्षण के बारे में बताया गया है। यह 2030 में भारत द्वारा अपनाए गए 2030 के एजेंडे के लक्ष्य 4 का भी वर्णन करता है। लक्ष्य 4 समावेशी और न्यायसंगत गुणवत्तापूर्ण शिक्षा सुनिश्चित करना और 2030 तक सभी के लिए आजीवन सीखने के अवसरों को बढ़ावा देना है। नीति में तेज़ी से बदलती वैश्विक अर्थव्यवस्था और रोज़गार के अवसरों पर भी चर्चा की गई है जो छात्रों के लिए सीखने में महत्वपूर्णता पैदा करते हैं। भारत का लक्ष्य 2040 तक उच्च गुणवत्ता वाली शिक्षा प्रदान करना भी है। इस नीति का मसौदा राष्ट्रीय शिक्षा नीति मसौदा पैनल के अध्यक्ष श्री कृष्णस्वामी कस्तूरीरंगन ने तैयार किया है। इसमें यह भी कहा गया है कि यह नीति शिक्षा प्रणाली में सुधार करती है। यह शिक्षकों की भर्ती में भी सुधार करता है और शिक्षकों को समाज का सबसे सम्मानित और आवश्यक सदस्य बनाने के लिए एक नई प्रणाली को फिर से स्थापित करता है।

भारत में शिक्षा नीति 2020 (NEP)

फिर नीति में हर छात्र की अनूठी क्षमताओं को पहचानने, पहचानने और विकसित करने, तीसरी कक्षा तक साहित्य और अंकों में बुनियादी आधार स्तर प्राप्त करने, लचीली शिक्षा, विभागों के बीच कोई भेदभाव नहीं, पाठ्यक्रम गतिविधियों के लिए समान महत्व के साथ बहु-विषयक शिक्षा प्रणाली, व्यावहारिक समझ, रचनात्मकता, आलोचनात्मक सोच और विश्लेषण, वैचारिक उन्नयन, संवैधानिक उपदेशों के माध्यम से नैतिकता और मानव मूल्यों को विकसित करने, जीवन को सही ढंग से प्रबंधित करने के लिए आवश्यक व्यावहारिक कौशल, प्रौद्योगिकी का उपयोग आदि जैसे मौलिक सिद्धांतों का वर्णन किया गया है। फिर नीति को चार भागों में वर्गीकृत किया गया है जैसे भाग 1- स्कूली शिक्षा, भाग 2- उच्च शिक्षा, भाग-3 व्यावसायिक शिक्षा और अन्य सभी प्रमुख क्षेत्र, भाग-4 विभिन्न शिक्षा बोर्डों को मजबूत करना और वित्तपोषित करना, आदि। वर्तमान शिक्षा प्रणाली और छात्रों की अपेक्षा के दृष्टिकोण से, यह माना जाता है कि NEP 2020 शैक्षिक नीति में एक नई क्रांति लाएगी, और साथ ही भारत में साक्षरता की दर में सुधार की बड़ी गुंजाइश है। यह NEP 2020 छात्रों को 3- 18 वर्ष की आयु के बीच शिक्षा छोड़ने से भी मदद करता है। यह छात्रों को बिना किसी प्रतिबंध के शिक्षा की एक लचीली प्रणाली को आगे बढ़ाने में भी मदद करता है। कई छात्र नए बदलावों की उम्मीद कर रहे थे, कुछ छात्र नहीं, लेकिन मेरे अवलोकन के अनुसार मौजूदा प्रणाली में बदलाव लाने का यह सही समय है और NEP2020 पहली नीति होगी जिसमें छात्रों को लाभान्वित करने वाले विभिन्न बदलाव होंगे। नीति का सबसे सराहनीय हिस्सा यह है कि भारतीय ्छात्रों को सार्वभौमिक ज्ञान से लैस करने का उनका उद्देश्य सबसे अच्छा हिस्सा है जो छात्रों को वैश्विक प्लेटफार्मों पर खुद् को लॉन्च करने में मदद करता है।
